WHAT'S HAPPENING AT THE BLUFFS?

The Lordship Improvement Association has nearly completed the planning stages for a major restoration of The Bluffs, including measures to improve beach access, stem erosion, remove invasive plants, and restore the habitat with many of the native bushes, trees, flowers, and plants that we once enjoyed. The LIA intends to rebuild the "main path," a footpath that once ran through the underbrush below 'The Bluffs' extending from Lordship Road to Laurel Street. This path will create a "nature's classroom" where residents can observe the rare habitat up close, and learn more about its value to the environment and our community. Most likely, the path will need an application of wood chips every year.

WINTER STORM NEMO

As winter storm Nemo approached the first week of February, forecasters estimated between four and thirty inches may fall in our neighborhood. So how did Lordship end up with a record breaking 34 inches of the white stuff blanketing our community? We've heard the warnings before, and were cautious doing the best to prepare, clearing the grocery stores of milk, eggs, and bread as if we'd be stranded for days. By Friday evening, with snow falling lightly most of the afternoon the totals were less than six inches. As day turned into night, we prepared our shovels, and stood by with snow blowers ready for battle. On Saturday morning we quickly realized that bucket loaders and snowmobiles would be the only logical means to move about Lordship. Overnight, Lordship was transformed into a life-size snow globe. With a state of emergency declared, roads were impassable, emergency services were limited and the neighborhood stood silent, impaired with snow depths more familiar to Buffalo or Duluth. Thirty-six hours after the last flakes had fallen; many streets in Lordship were still entombed in snow. With residents in survival mode, we ventured into our new arctic world, eight foot snow piles which flanked our local roadways, to check in on neighbors, assessing our property, and began the slow dig out from the record breaking snowfall. Plows and heavy equipment challenged by the depth of the snow, took more than a week to provide access to goods and services and return municipal buildings to a more regular schedule. LORDSHIP SMARTS

On February 1st, 2013 the Lordship Fathers Club hosted Lordship SMARTS a Science, Math and Arts Exposition. Lordship SMARTS, open to all residents of Lordship grades K-12, was intended promote importance of creativity, ingenuity, attention to detail and communication through Science. The more than 150 residents who attended the event spent almost two hours perusing the exhibits and were impressed with not only the ideas and craftsmanship, but, more importantly, the enthusiasm with which each student carefully described their exhibit. From Bee Keeping to Space Shuttles, the imagination of participants was exceptional in every regard. In addition to exhibits, volunteers from the community helped run hands-on science based activities, such as bridge building, buoyancy demonstrations, surface tension experiments and the discovery of animal tracks here in Lordship. A big thank you to all volunteers and participants who were involved, because of your efforts the expo was a success. Lordship SMARTS not only gave the children a sense of pride and accomplishment derived from participation in a Science Exposition, but also created an opportunity where the community could gather and appreciate students' efforts in science. Five judges from the Lordship community, with backgrounds in math and science, were impressed with the exhibits and deliberated intently before making their decisions. Each child received a certificate of participation, with the top winners in each category sharing more than \$1000 in prizes.
