On February 6th at the Lordship School from 5-7pm, The Lordship Fathers Club sponsored the Annual Lordship Science Expo, **LORDSHIP SMARTS**. It is open to any student, grades K-12, who resides in Lordship or attends Lordship School. Those who attended the event last month enjoyed the opportunity to participate in a variety of science based activities and witness the many amazing projects produced by local students.

All students who participate in LORDSHIP SMARTS received a participation certificate, and 21 prizes were delivered over the course of the evening including recognition of the top three exhibits in each of the following categories: Invention, Science through Art, Scientific Experiment, and Scientific Display. The Norwalk Maritime Aquarium, had a special

presentation this year with many small sea creatures on display for the students to observe and learn from Marine Scientists. Also participating, were Stratford High School Science Honor Society Students who helped run activities and share their enthusiasm for science.
